### 1.1 General description

PNP low  $V_{CEsat}$  Breakthrough In Small Signal (BISS) transistor in a SOT457 (SC-74) small Surface-Mounted Device (SMD) plastic package.

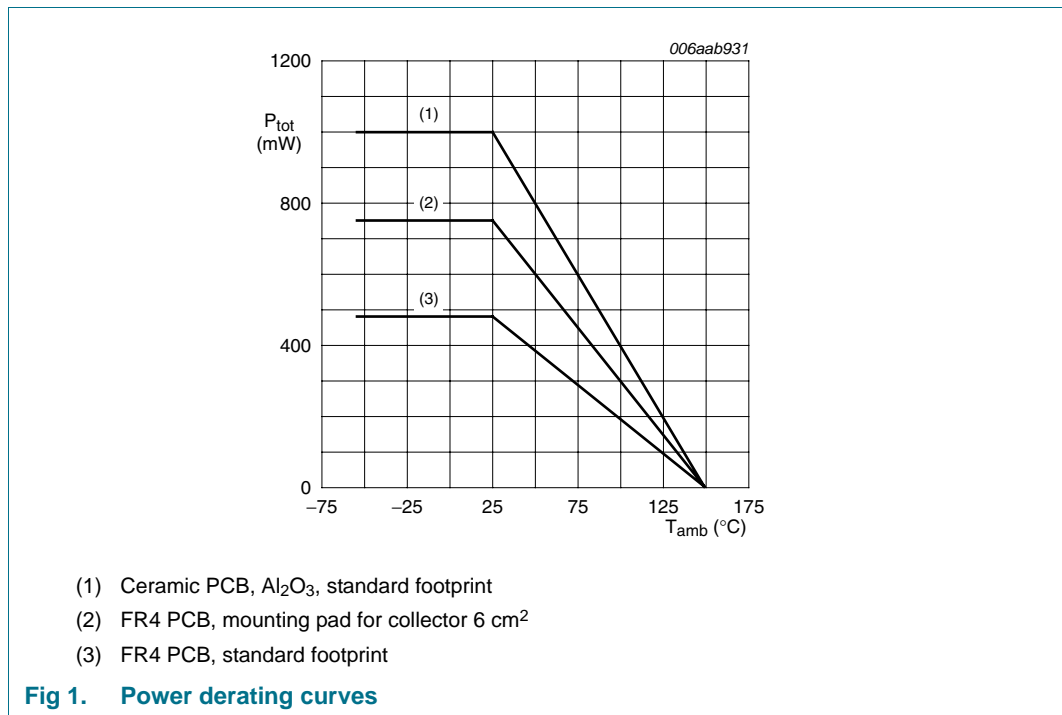

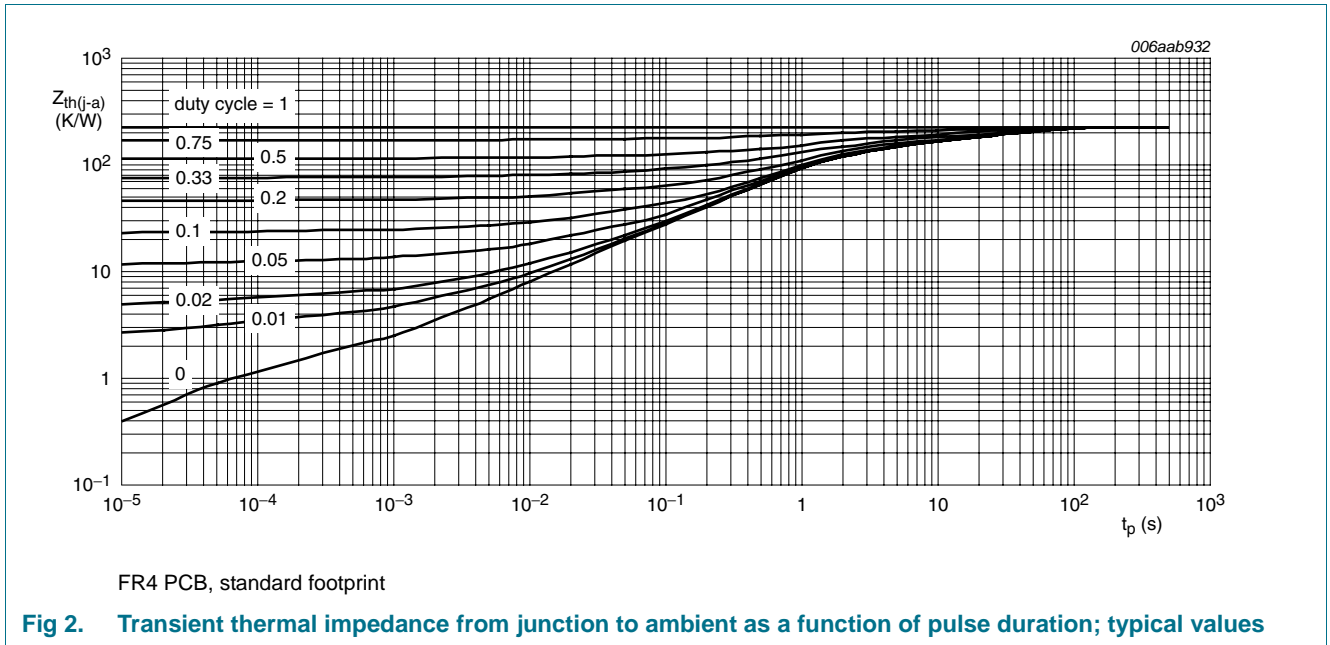

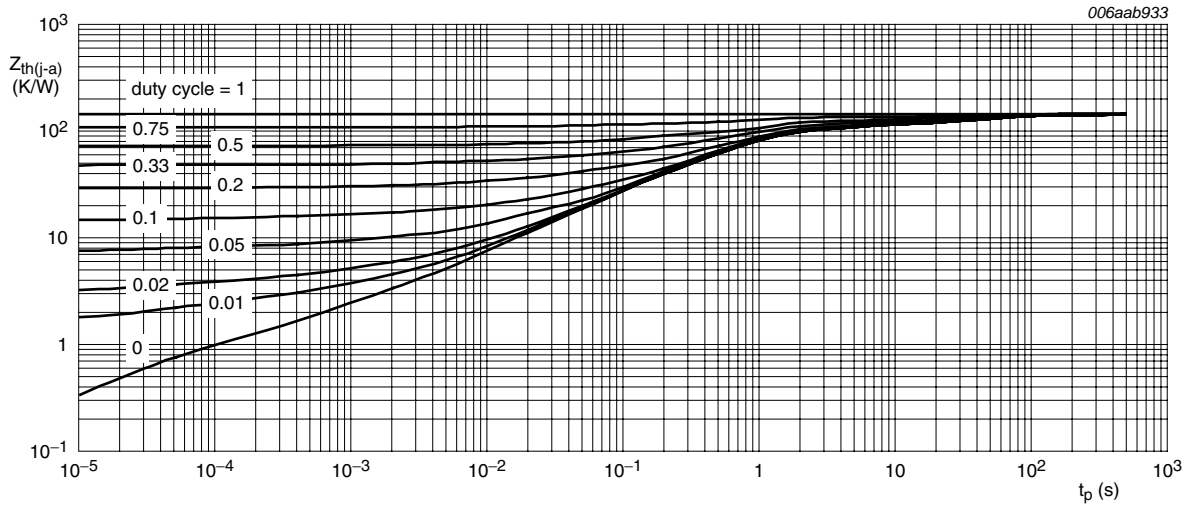


Fig 3. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values

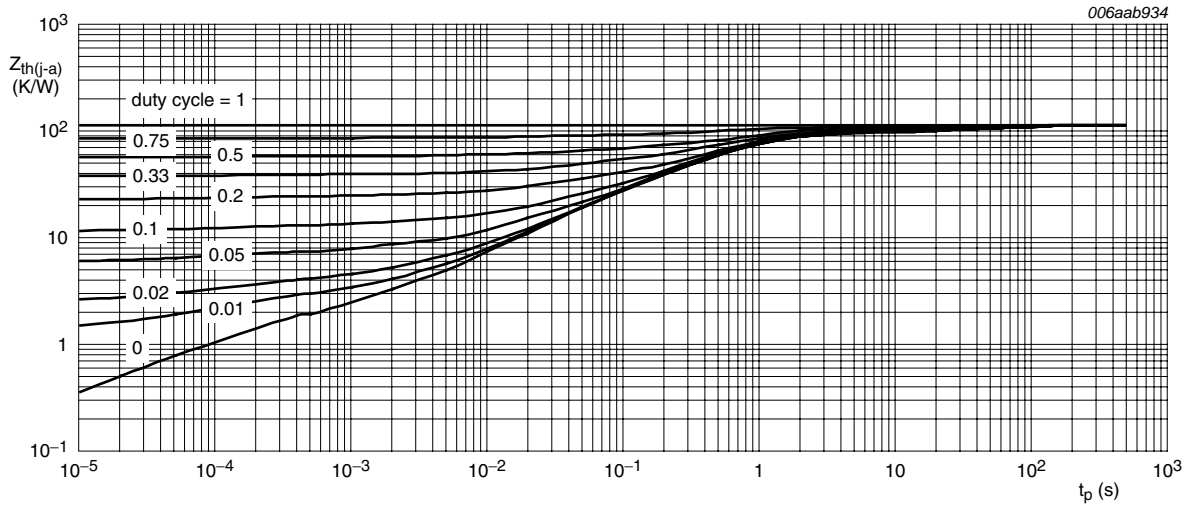


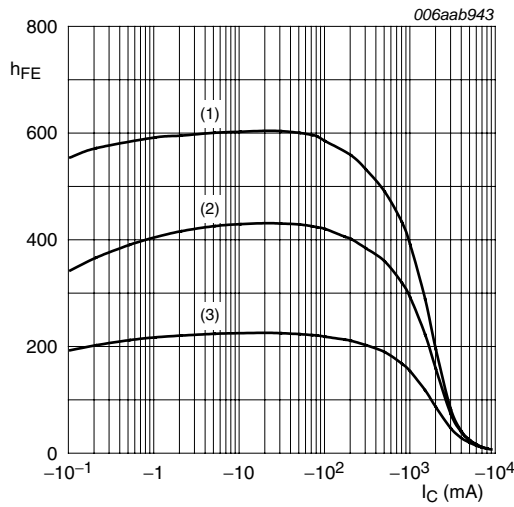
Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values

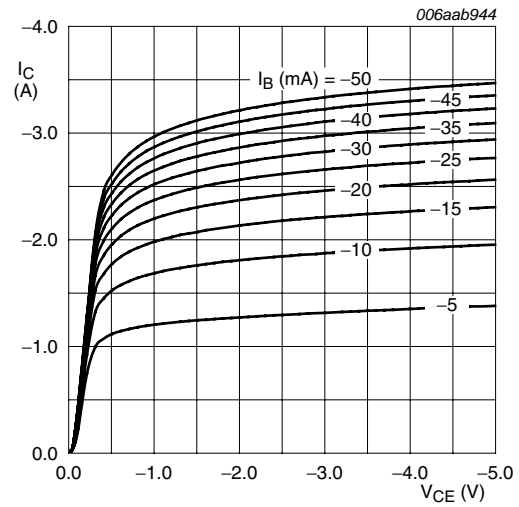

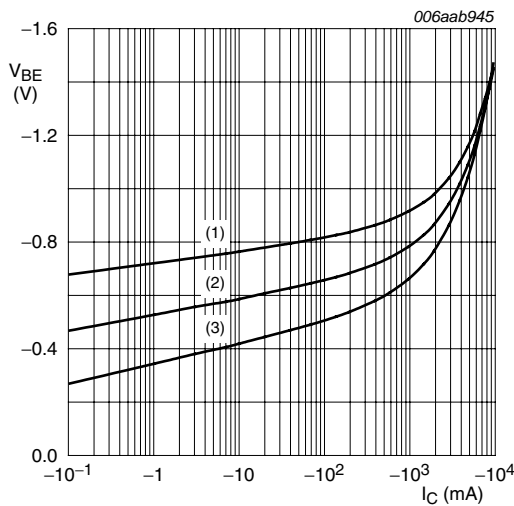

**Fig 5. DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values**



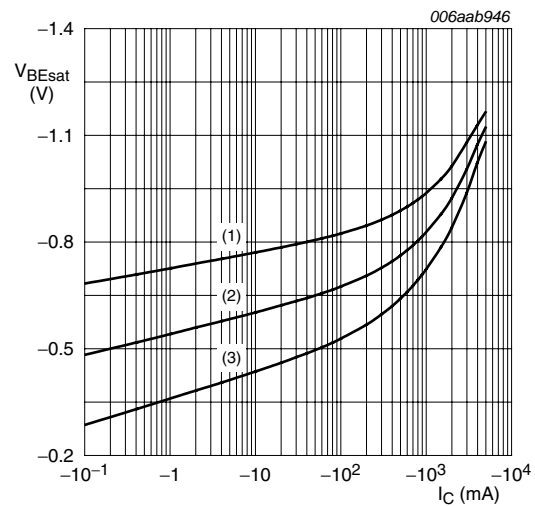

**Fig 6. Collector current as a function of collector-emitter voltage; typical values**



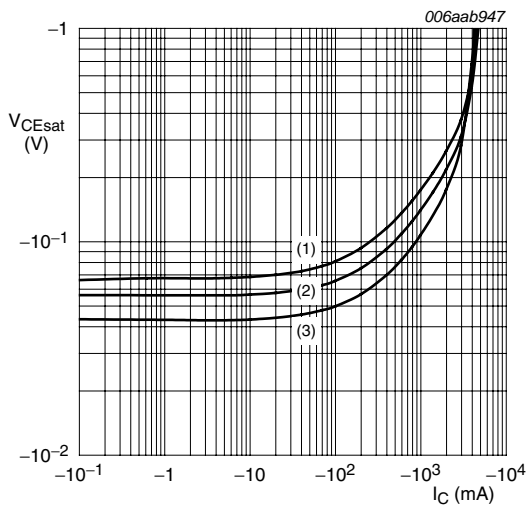

**Fig 7. Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values**



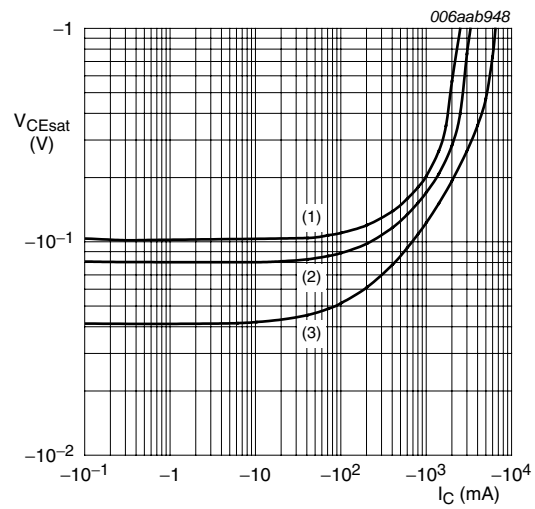

**Fig 8. Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values**



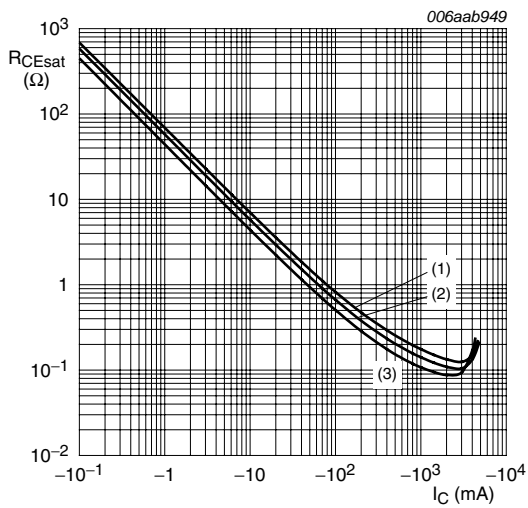

**Fig 9. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values**



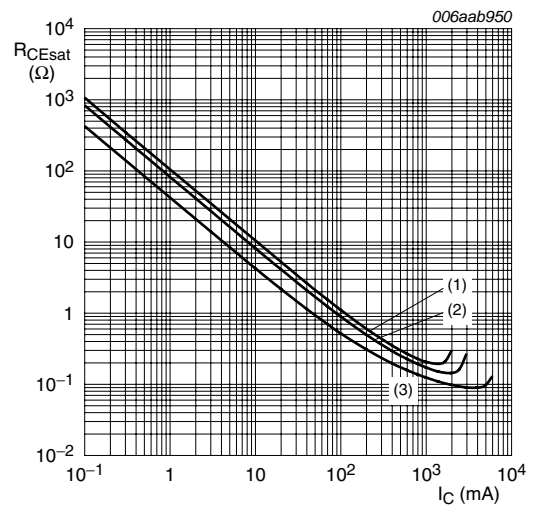

**Fig 11. Collector-emitter saturation resistance as a function of collector current; typical values**

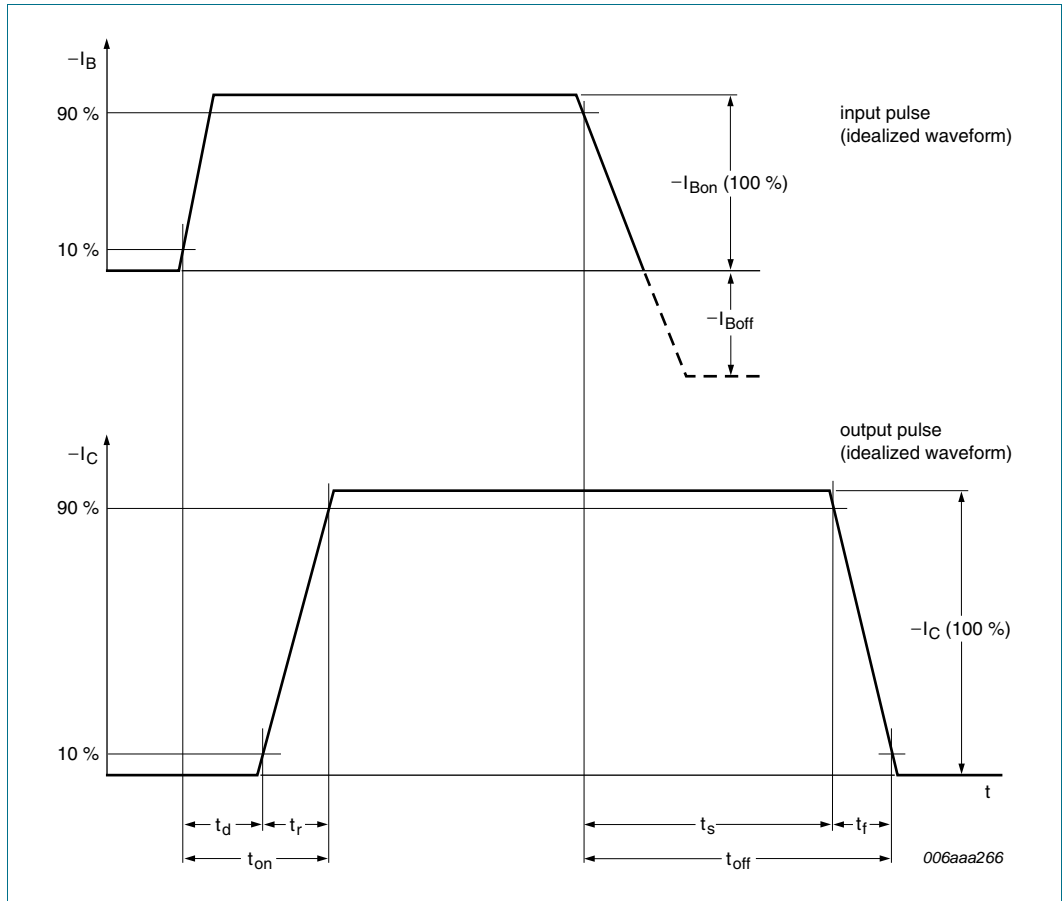

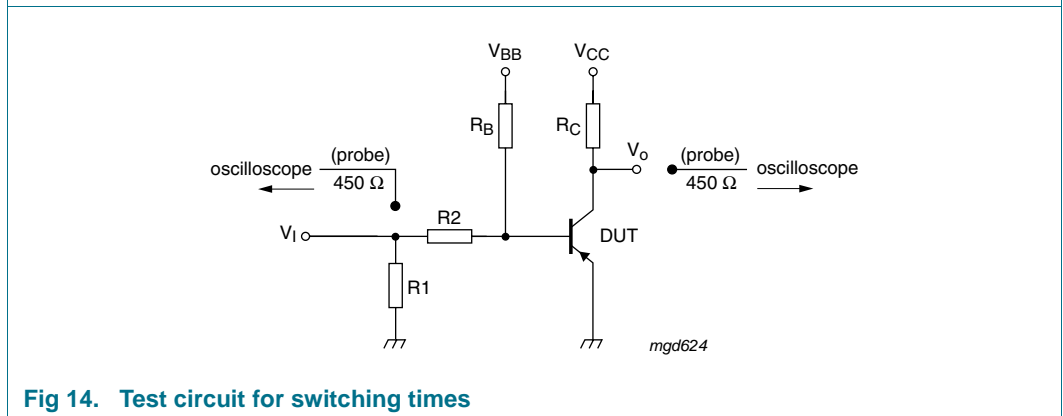
**Fig 12. Collector-emitter saturation resistance as a function of collector current; typical values**

**Fig 13. BISS transistor switching time definition**

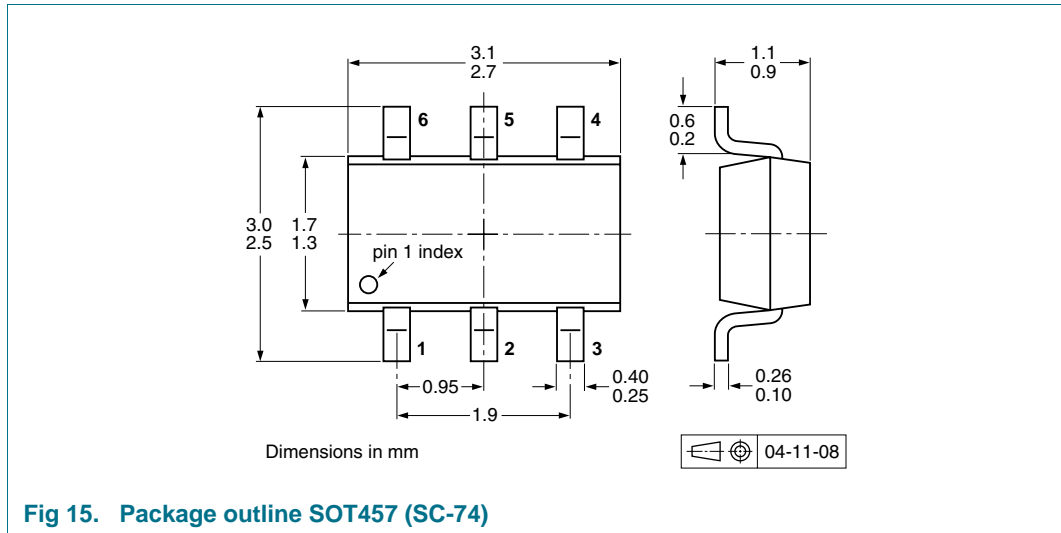


**Fig 14. Test circuit for switching times**

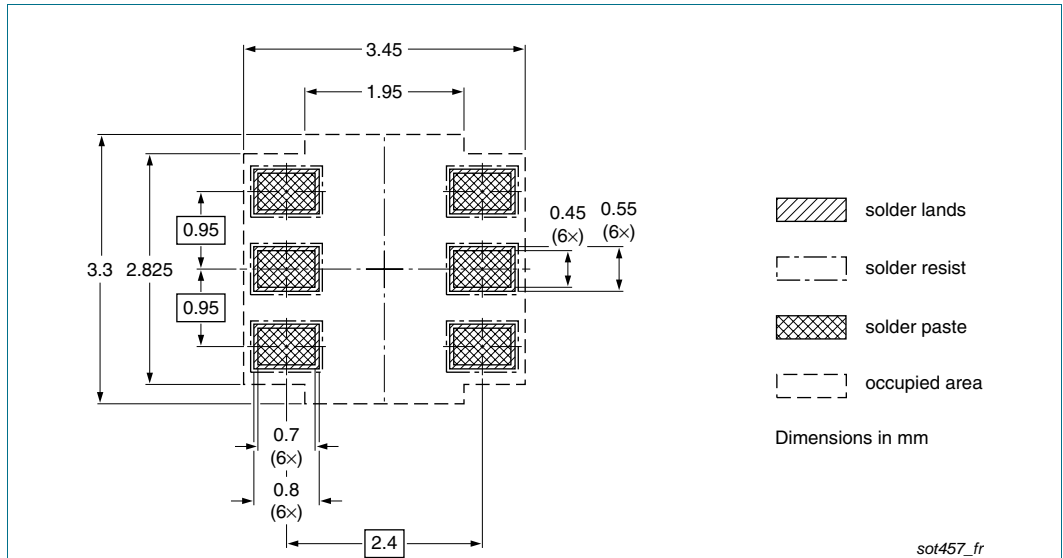

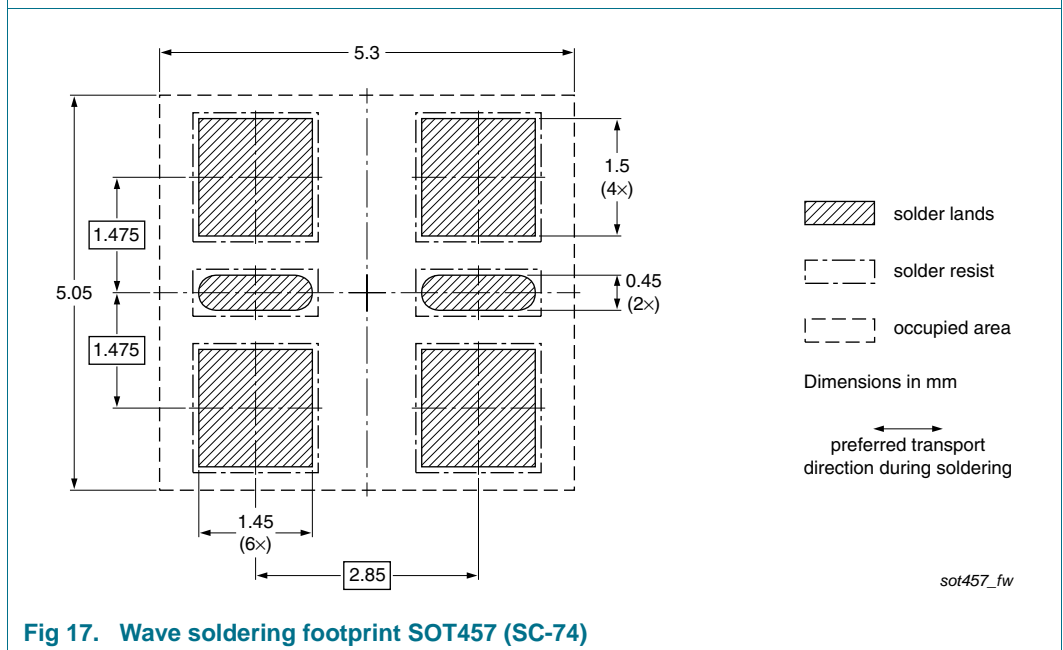
