#### 1.1 General description

Planar Maximum Efficiency General Application (MEGA) Schottky barrier rectifier with an integrated guard ring for stress protection, encapsulated in a SOD128 small and flat lead Surface-Mounted Device (SMD) plastic package.






FR4 PCB, standard footprint

Fig 2. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values







Fig 4. Forward current as a function of forward voltage; typical values






Fig 6. Diode capacitance as a function of reverse voltage; typical values


Fig 7. Average forward power dissipation as a function of average forward current; typical values

Fig 8. Average reverse power dissipation as a function of reverse voltage; typical values




FR4 PCB, standard footprint

FR4 PCB, mounting pad for cathode 1 cm<sup>2</sup>



Fig 10. Average forward current as a function of ambient temperature; typical values

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


Fig 11. Average forward current as a function of ambient temperature; typical values




The current ratings for the typical waveforms as shown in <u>Figure 9</u>, <u>10</u>, <u>11</u> and <u>12</u> are calculated according to the equations:  $I_{F(AV)} = I_M \times \delta$  with  $I_M$  defined as peak current,  $I_{RMS} = I_{F(AV)}$  at DC, and  $I_{RMS} = I_M \times \sqrt{\delta}$  with  $I_{RMS}$  defined as RMS current.

This product has been qualified in accordance with the Automotive Electronics Council (AEC) standard *Q101 - Stress test qualification for discrete semiconductors*, and is suitable for use in automotive applications.


