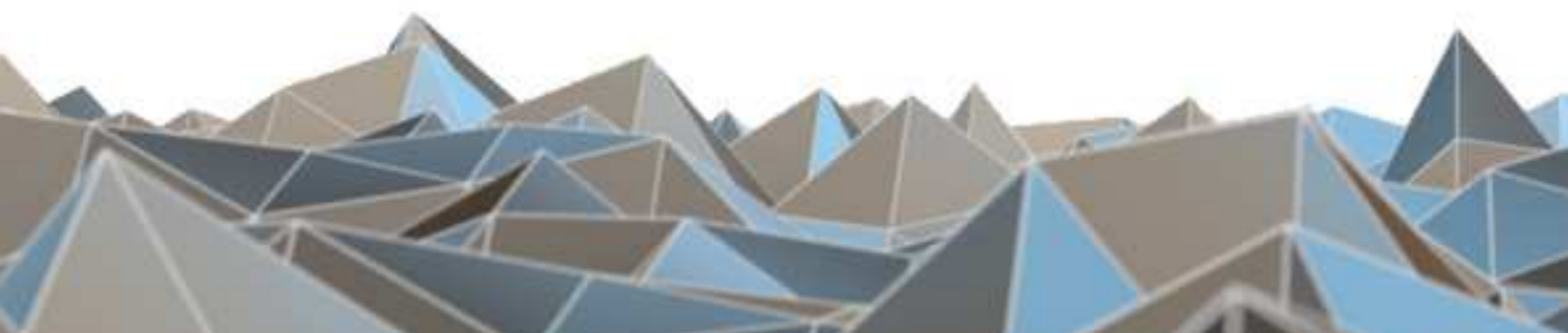

1. Download the newest Version of the Bluetechnix NFC Suite lite from the [Bluetechnix homepage](#).

2. Extract the zip file.
3. Start the setup.exe and follow the installation instructions.

## 6 Getting Started

### 6.1 NFC Suite lite

Insert the NFC Adapter into a free USB port of your computer and start the NFC Suite lite.

#### 6.1.1 Read

The NFC Suite lite includes four read actions, see Figure 6.1.1. Select one or more read actions by clicking on it. Place a NFC card in a close range to the NFC Adapter to execute the actions.

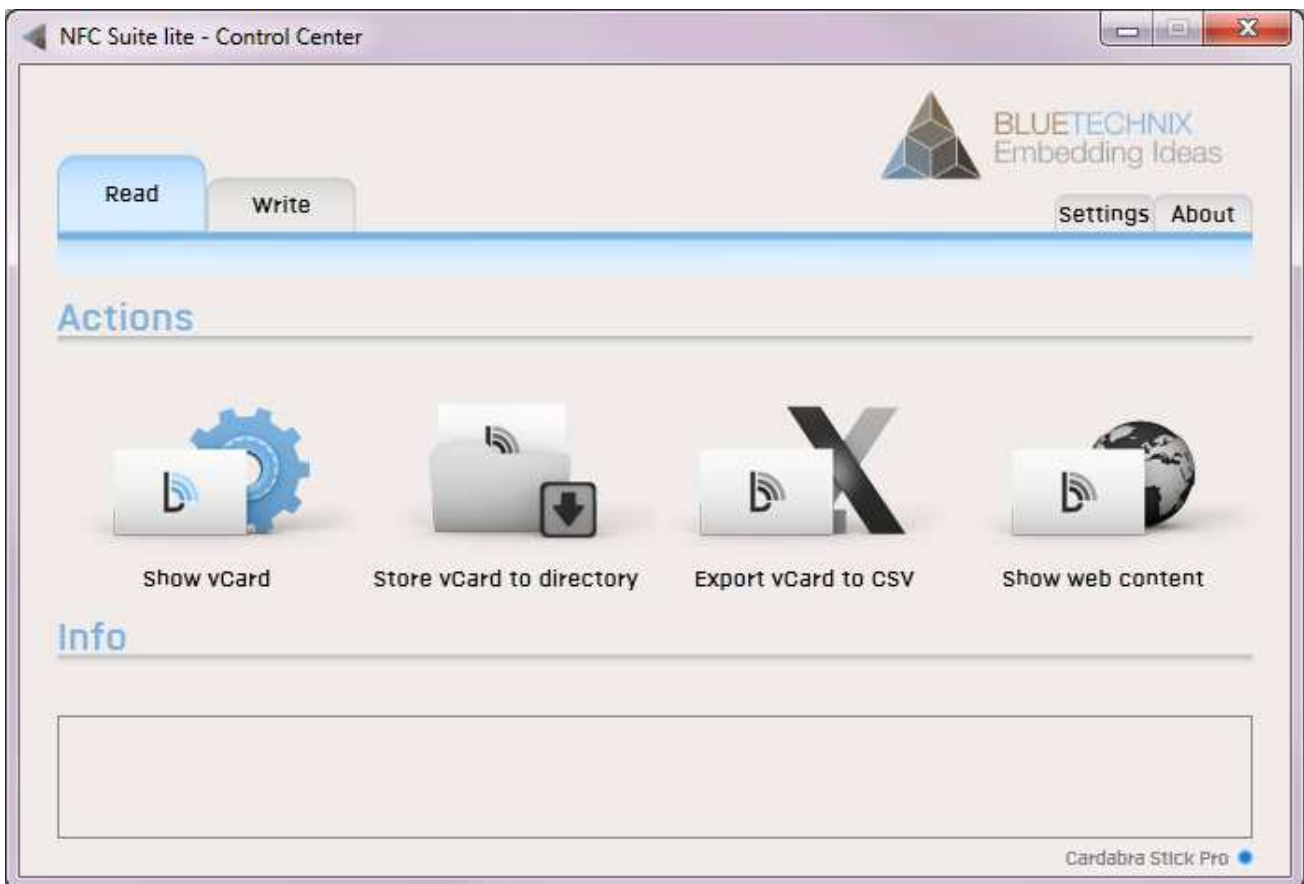


Figure 6.1: Read a NFC card



## 6.1.2 Write

Select a vCard file or an Internet Shortcut which you want to write to the NFC tag. Click on the “write to NFC tag” symbol, see Figure 6.1.2, and Place a NFC card in a close range to the NFC Adapter write to the NFC tag.

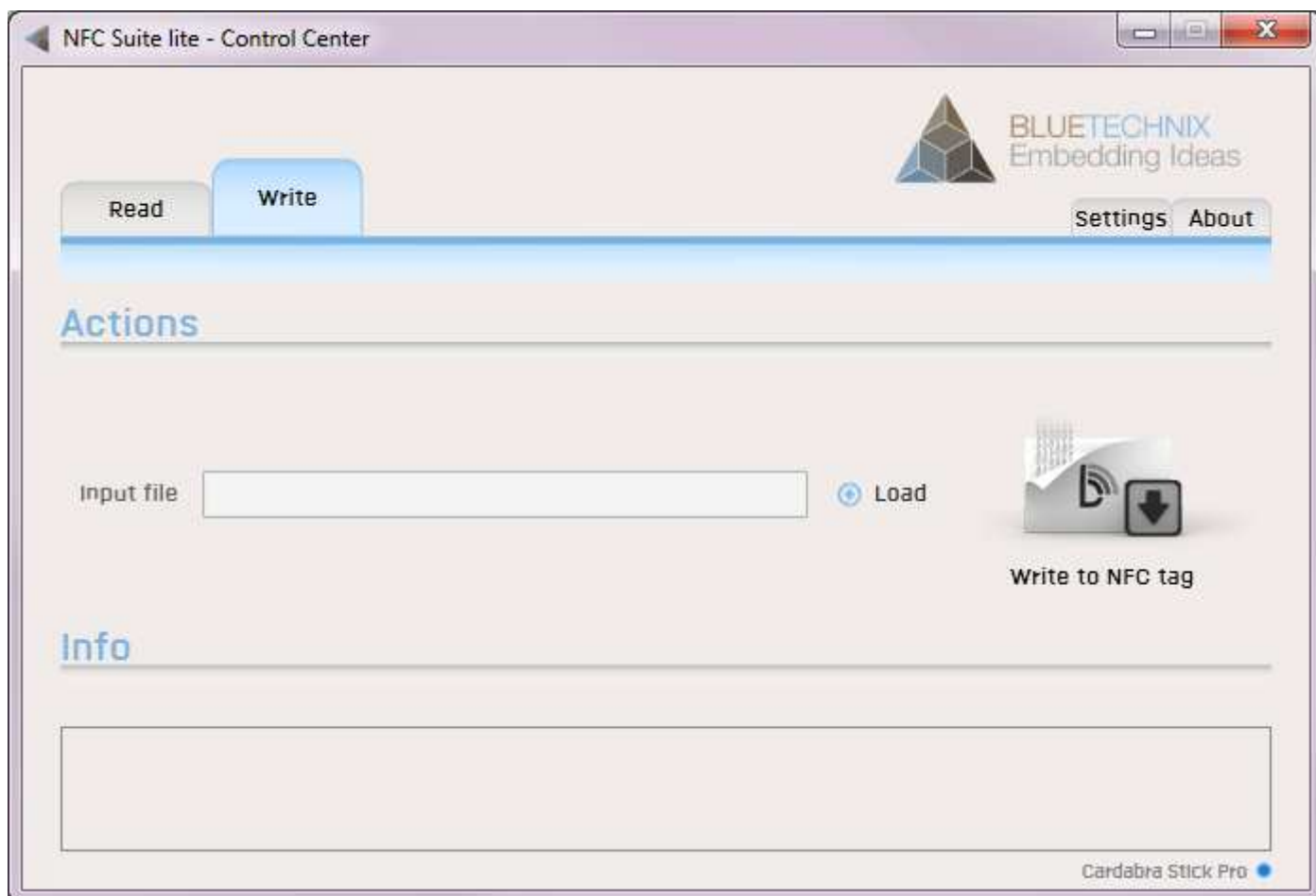


Figure 6.2: Write a NFC card
